

Exporting CorelDraw files as PDF, TIF and JPG

Exporting as PDF:

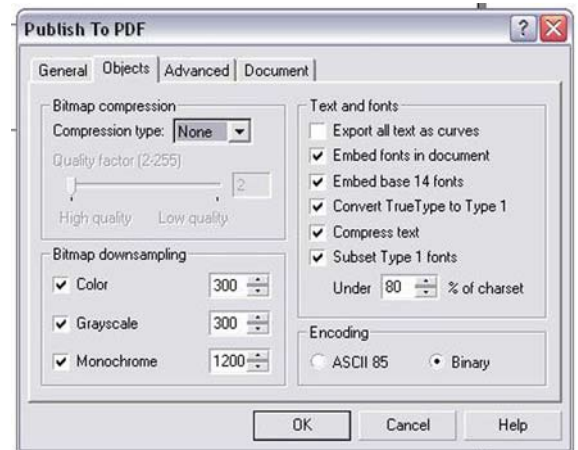
Go to the “File” menu and choose “Publish To PDF”. Most of the settings should be ok but here are some things that must be checked:

Output colour should be CMYK

Resolution should be set at 300dpi

Output all text as curves

Click “Ok” and save the PDF to your computer.



Exporting as TIF:

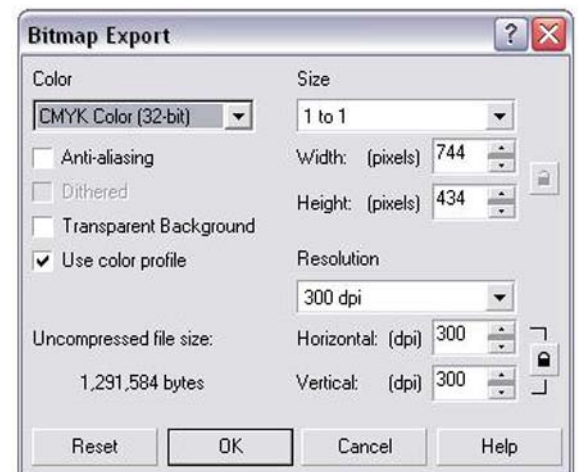
Go to the “File” menu and choose “Export”. From the drop-down menu, with the choice of different file formats, choose “TIF - TIFF Bitmap”. Again, most of the settings are fine but here are some things to check:

Output colour as CMYK

Resolution should be set at 300dpi

Size needs to be set at 1:1

Click “Ok” and save the TIF to your computer.



Exporting as JPG:

JPG is virtually the same as a TIF but there is an extra step to go through. Go to the “File” menu and choose “Export”. From the drop-down menu, with the choice of different file formats, choose “JPG - JPEG Bitmaps”. Again, most of the settings are fine but here are some things to check:

Output colour as CMYK

Resolution should be set at 300dpi

Size needs to be set at 1:1

Click “Ok” and another window should pop up with some compression options. Set the encoding to “Progressive” and set the “Compression” and “Smoothing” sliders to 0.

Click “Ok” and save the JPG to your computer.
